

TRAINING PROGRAMS



The Centre for Refugee Research offers a series of short training courses. They are conducted at The University of New South Wales, or on request at locations in Australia and internationally.

Courses can be specially tailored to meet the needs of groups of participants, and on the request of various refugee groups, some of these courses have now been offered on the Thai Burma Border and in Kakuma Refugee Camp, Kenya.

These programs are designed to provide a range of practical skills and knowledge for people working with refugee communities and people from refugee like backgrounds. They are based on recent innovations in service provision and community development and cover both theoretical perspectives and skills development. The courses are interactive with presentations, group discussions, structured exercises and role play. Upon completion of a course participants take away immediately applicable models and proformas for their work. Course notes and background readings are provided to participants.

The Centre offers as many courses as can be accommodated. Demand exceeds our capacity to respond. All courses are taught by either the Centre Director, or qualified Centre project staff.
